

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE ORDER OF CONTEMPT (PROPERTY SETTLEMENT)

HEADING

The heading on this pleading should be the same as the heading in the original case. The case number will also be the same.

- a. Enter the name of the county where the original case was filed.
- b. Enter the name of the plaintiff exactly as listed in the original case.
- c. Enter the name of the defendant exactly as listed in the original case.
- d. The clerk of the district court assigned a number when the original case was filed. You must include that case number on any papers you file, including this action for contempt.

BODY OF ORDER

When you go to your hearing, you may ask to approach the judge to give the judge the proposed Order of Contempt (Property Settlement).

The judge will fill in the rest of the blanks in the order according to the findings at the hearing. In most instances, the judge will announce the findings in the courtroom.

DATE LINE

Leave this line blank. The judge will fill in the date when he or she signs the document.

FINAL SIGNATURE

If the judge approves the order, the judge will sign the order.
